Your board members attended regional meetings with the representatives of other state and regional associations to discuss governmental affairs and water treatment concerns across the country. "Doing the Write Thing"

After recent events with one of my local Health Department's I have seen that "the way it always has been done" is not always the best.

The Health Department informed me the P.O.E that has been used for 20 years was wrong and not the P.O.E per the Health Department definition, after a meeting "penalty phase" I got nowhere with talking to them and had been told I have no option but to take the penalty of \$450.00 It could have been up to \$2250.00.

After leaving the meeting I reached out to friends trying to figure out a way to get the Health Department to see it was a lack of education. Everyone said to right a letter.

While still mad I made notes of what was said. After calming down, I put together a nice letter and time line. Then had someone else proof read the letter, "never write mad ", by doing this I showed the Health Department had made some mistakes as can happen with a department that has a large turnover of employees. I got the penalty down to \$100.00 as well as a change in reporting time to 15 days. The Health Department has to respond, this can help us fix a problem without a penalty.

It turned out standing up to the Health Department was as easy as sitting down and writing a letter.
